Map & Gap Supply Chain Karratha - Final Report Released


Regional Development Australia (RDA) Pilbara and the City of Karratha have worked in partnership to produce the Map and Gap Supply Chain Study.

The study within the local government area of City of Karratha investigated opportunities and target gaps in the local business market and leverage supply chain opportunities for local businesses.

Fourteen key findings were identified and strategies have been provided in this study.

North West Aged Care Strategy

The nearly completed North West Aged Care Strategy is a result of a joint partnership between RDA Pilbara and RDA Kimberley.

This report will provide:

- Map and gap analysis of aging and aged care services and facilities in the two regions;
- Explore models of aged care provision that will attract and retain aging people across the regions;
- Challenge the assumption that Pilbara and Kimberley are not retirement destinations;
- Focus on providing opportunities for Aboriginal people to age on country; and
- Develop a plan that identifies guiding principles, realist goals and strategic outcomes with specific actions, timeframes and responsibilities.
