National Firearms Amnesty 2017



The national firearms amnesty aims to help keep the community safe by ensuring unregistered firearms don't fall into the wrong hands

From 1 July 2017 to 30 September 2017, individuals who have an unregistered firearm or firearm-related article in their possession - for whatever reason- will have the chance to legally dispose of it without penalty.

In Australia, all firearms must be registered. Now is the time to dispose of or register a firearm without penalty.
